SINCE OCTOBER...we've been busy interviewing! Thank you to everyone who has shared their memories of Garden Home. We've learned a lot!

George Babbitt recalled how he had dug out a partial basement by hand in the Canfield house which meant he had to do so by starting to dig down from the crawl space under the building!



The Canfield house was first owned by the Methodist Church, which also owned several other properties in the area. According to an old map one was near the current Garden Home Park but not at the church site. The Canfield house was used by circuit riders that came through

to preach at the church in the teens and 1920s.

Carolyn Ernstrom Welch remembers Mrs. O'Dell the "Egg Lady" who would walk up Garden Home Road. Carolyn thought she was selling the eggs but doesn't know who bought them.

Carlo Poutala established the "Firlock Paint Company" in the garage behind his house.

And before it became known as the Partlow House, Olive Stott Gabriel, an early female lawyer and active feminist, lived in that house! Olive had no children and the house was left to her nephews.

We are still listening to stories that delight and enlighten us and look forward to sharing them with all of you.
